1 DAY OVERVIEW

Who's it for? – Suitable for practitioners responding to family violence.

Key learnings – An overview of the Safe and Together Model. Including:

- How to develop child protection and systems that are family violence informed
- Introduction to Multiple Pathways to harm framework
- Why partnering with survivors and using a survivor strengths approach is integral for achieving safety and change for families/whānau.



4 DAY CORE

Who's it for? – Suitable for practitioners responding to family violence who want to strengthen their ability to keep children safe, support survivors, and hold users of violence accountable.

This training works best in a multiagency setting.

Key learnings –

- **Assessment** – Understanding patterns of harm and their impact on children and family functioning.
- **Interviewing** – Practicing interviews with users of violence, survivors, and children.
- **Documentation** – Improving language to be survivor strengths based and child focused.
- **Case Planning** – Developing plans that keep children safe and together with protective parents.

This training uses group exercises and action planning to support learnings of practical tools.
